ENTRY FEES PER DAY

\$25.00 for the first entry of each dog each day (includes \$3.50 AKC recording fee)

\$15.00 for all subsequent entries (includes \$3.00 AKC recording fee)

Make all checks payable in U.S. funds to Poodle Club of San Antonio (PCSA). All entries must be submitted on official AKC agility entry forms, one dog per entry form. Photocopies of front and back are accepted only if legible and official AKC size. Entries will not be accepted without fees and signature on agreement on the back of entry form. Please waive "signature required" on all expedited entries. Send entries to Emily Forsyth, Trial Secretary, 11504 Forest Rain, San Antonio, TX 78233.

Online entries: This trial is accepting online entries through AKC Online Entry Services.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor.

PCSA reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog because of aggression, disease, injury, or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the PCSA or any official thereof.

This club does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.

COURSE FAMILIARIZATION AND WARM-UPS

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. Handlers with multiple dogs, at events with multiple rings, may request to walk with a height group other than the one their dog is entered in if a conflict is imminent. A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

Class Changes Effective January 1, 2020 – PCSA WILL OFFER EACH OF THESE

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers with Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

Entering for Exhibition Only (FEO)

As of January 1, 2020, For Exhibition Only may be offered at the option of the host club. FEO will be offered on a one-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. **FEO is only allowed in the Time 2 Beat and FAST classes.** FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Competitors must enter in T2B and/or FAST. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) (T2B and/or FAST) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring
 - Toys must be non-audible
 - Toys may not leave the handler's hand
 - Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and/or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time

(Note: This section only needs to be published in the Premium List if the Club is offering FEO.)

Fix and Go On (FNG)

As of January 1, 2020, Fix and Go On will be offered on a one-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER:

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number. Approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations, it includes both sexes. Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.

MOVE-UPS

Move-ups for the first day of the trial will be accepted in writing prior to 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 17, 2020. Send email move-ups to Nortsmom@swbell.net. Move-ups for the subsequent days of this trial will be accepted no later than 30 minutes after the completion of the trial on Saturday and Sunday on forms provided. Per Chapter 1, Section 20, exhibitors may show up at the trial site and request a move-up in writing to the trial secretary not later than the day preceding the event. Also, A dog which has been entered in a Novice A class for which it is not eligible to be entered in due to class restrictions on the dog or the handler may be moved to the Novice B class under the following conditions: The request for the move must be in writing and presented to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial. The request must state the reason and justification for the move from a Novice A class to a Novice B class.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

Classes will have flat ribbons awarded to the first through fourth place in each jump height. Dogs must qualify to receive placement ribbons. Only 1st place ribbons are awarded in the T2B titling class. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving qualifying scores. A New Title ribbon will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title. A MACH or PACH rosette and decorated MACH/PACH bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain their MACH or PACH. **AGCH Rosettes and decorated AGCH bar will be available for handler/dog teams that earn their title of Agility Grand Champion.**

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. PCSA and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. PCSA reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog because of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against ADOC or any official thereof.

All dogs **MUST be on a leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.**

TRIAL HOURS AND CRATING

- Trial hours will be 7 am to 30 minutes after the last run. The crating space is limited.
- Unentered dogs will be allowed only if you are able to stack their crate on top of an entered dog's crate and owned by the exhibitor. No other dogs are allowed on the trial site. No X pens or mats will be allowed. Please stack your crates as allowed.
- The facility is not available to us until Friday morning. Absolutely NO set up on Thursday night.
- **MUST cover crate if requested by a member of the Trial committee**

ATTENTION VOLUNTEERS!!!

ADOC appreciates everyone who helps make our trials successful by contributing their time. With your e-mailed final confirmation, will be a link to sign up online for ring crews. We will also have volunteer sign-up sheets at the trial. This should eliminate conflicts and give you a chance to choose your jobs. Fill it out early to grab the spots you want. Workers will receive a ticket for a worker raffle for each class worked. The Chief Ring Steward will distribute the tickets. The club will also provide water, snacks, and lunch for workers who work for two or more classes.

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

- All exhibitors and/or handlers are responsible for entering their dogs in the proper height classification. In the Regular classes, dogs may run in a higher height division, but not a lower height division than their measured height division. In the Preferred Class, dogs MUST jump their measured height division.
- If an email address is provided, email notification of your entry status will be sent prior to closing as entries are processed. If an email address is provided, email notification of your move-up will be sent prior to closing as move-ups are processed.
- **If you do not receive an email confirmation of your move-up, please verify receipt of your move-up with the trial secretary**
- If an email address is provided, confirmations & judging schedules will be sent via email after closing. Confirmations & judging schedules will only be mailed to those who did not provide an email address or the email address is not valid.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

- Choke collars, pinch collars, prong collars, electric and dummy electric collars are prohibited on trial grounds.
- Exhibitors are responsible for being at the ring gate when it is their turn to run. Judges need not wait for any dog holding up a class. PCSA, DePaw Dog Sports and Training Academy, and the Trial Secretary have no obligation or responsibility for locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.
- Exhibitors are responsible for picking up after their own dogs. A clearly marked exercise area will be located near the show barn.
- All dogs present must be on leash or confined to crates when not being judged, except when in the designated warmup areas.
- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations
- The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.
- PCSA and DePaw Dog Sports and Training Academy assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children.
- Entry fee will not be refunded in the event that the dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee.
- No entry fee will be returned if the Trial cannot open or be completed because of civil disturbance, fire, an act of God, public emergency, the act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In that case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.
- **Exhibitors are responsible for complete, accurate, and legible information on their entry forms; illegible or incomplete entries cannot be entered in the show. PLEASE PRINT OR TYPE CLEARLY. IF THE ENTRY FORM IS PHOTOCOPIED OR FAXED, THE AGREEMENT ON THE BACK OF THE FORM MUST ALSO BE PHOTOCOPIED OR FAXED AND ATTACHED TO THE ENTRY WHEN IT IS MAILED OR FAXED. ENTRY FORMS CANNOT BE ACCEPTED IF THEY ARE UNSIGNED OR IF THEY SPECIFY ANY CONDITIONS AS TO ITS ACCEPTANCE.** Unsigned Entry Forms cannot be accepted or entries which specify any conditions as to its acceptance.
- No refund for duplicate entries. Care will be taken to find duplicates; however, if an entry has been processed no refund will be made.
- Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and PCSA will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check
- **Bitches in season are not allowed to compete or be on the trial grounds. PCSA will refund entry fees for bitches in season. The Trial Secretary must receive written notification from the owner the day before the trial starts by noon. Refunds will be mailed after the close of the event.**
- No dogs may be left at the trial site overnight.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine Partners ProgramSM may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No.box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler Number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767.
